

What is Guided Reading?

Guided Reading is a small group practice where the teacher supports students to read independently. Students are organised into groups of similar reading ability. The teacher then guides them as they decode, read, talk, and think their way through a text.


GUIDED READING PROCESS

Before	During	After
- activate prior knowledge	- observe readers behaviour	- check for understanding
- encourage student prediction	- assist in problem solving using information	- develop insight into characters and themes
- introduce new vocabulary	- give timely feedback	- invite personal responses
- set the scene	- confirm attempts	- facilitate discussion
